Weighing Method

Method 1: by weighing

After a shipment has been packed completely, the shipment can be weighed by regular equipment (scales, fork lift scales, crane scales etc). The applied weighing equipment must fulfil the tolerance limits and accuracy class in the country of loading.

Method 2: by calculation

All packages and cargo items may be weighted individually, inclusive mass of dunnage, packing and securing material and added to the tara weight of the container (tara weight for FCL shipment only). The applied weighing method needs to be certified and approved in the country of loading.
